Church Instruments

IN THE SANCTUARY



Möller Organ Opus 8093

Originally installed in 1951, the III manual/63 rank Möller organ provides the musical foundation for worship in the sanctuary. It has since been renovated twice, in 1988 and in 2006. The organ has 51 stops and 2, 315 pipes making it one of the largest instruments in the Fayetteville metropolitan area. Its majestic tones support congregational singing.

Steinway Grand Piano

The beautiful 7-foot Steinway Grand Piano dates from 1872. It is a generous gift to the church from the estate of Frank Thompson in 2005.

Kawai Grand Piano

The 6'-9" Kawai grand piano in the chancel is used to accompany soloists and the chancel choir. It was manufactured in 1991.

IN THE CHAPEL

Möller Organ Opus 7954

The Möller organ in the chapel was originally installed in Eden, North Carolina in 1949. It was moved to Fayetteville for use in the chapel in 2011 and has been completely rebuilt by the Miller Pipe Organ Company, Buford Georgia. It was expanded from its original 8 ranks to 13 ranks of pipe. The refurbished organ was installed in the Chapel and dedicated in 2012 to the memory of Brenda Carter McFadyen.

Kawai Baby Grand Piano

The Chapel 5-foot baby grand Kawaii piano was given in loving memory of Alton and Anne Edmondson in 1997.

Sperrhake Harpsichord

The Sperrhake Harpsichord is a double manual instrument, built in Passau, Germany in the 1960s. It has three sets of strings, which are plucked to produce a wonderful light string tone. The harpsichord was donated, refurbished and placed in the Chapel in 2012.
