Don't forget our custom of flowering the cross on the front porch of the church for Easter. You can bring cut flowers to place on the cross beginning on Saturday.

Some of Jesus' first words to his disciples on Easter morning were, "Don't be afraid." I need to hear those words again, and I suspect you do too. In a time when fears abound, the God of Easter promises the ultimate answer to the ultimate fear. Come and hear the good news, one more time!
