A PASTORAL MESSAGE

A writer I like, named Frederick Buechner, does a great job pointing out how Easter is not Christmas. Christmas has become so carefully scripted, so wellrehearsed, that if the original three kings and their camels came by our house, we'd know exactly who they are. Christmas holds much delight but few surprises.

Not so Easter. Buechner writes:

The symbol of Easter is the empty tomb. You can't depict or domesticate emptiness. You can't make it into pageants and string it with lights.

Easter is the unexpected surprise ending to a sad story that makes sense to nobody but God. In Mark's gospel we read that it simply happened. Nobody was counting on it. The few people that saw it weren't sure what to

make of it. Again, Buechner writes:

He rose. A few saw him briefly and talked to him. If it is true, there is nothing left to say. If it is not true, there is nothing left to say. For believers and unbelievers both. life has never been the same again. For some, neither has death.

The Christian's final hope for our world's great pain, flagrant injustice, and desperate search for meaning is resurrection from the dead. No pageant can do it justice. No explanation is adequate. It is God's to give. It is ours to gratefully believe and one day receive.

We need to take Easter to heart and move on with hope. You'll notice we are relaxing some of our seating limitations in worship as favorable news concerning the

the pandemic continues. We encourage you, if you wish, to hold committee meetings and small group meetings at the church building. We continue to need masks for such events and to pay thoughtful attention to social distance. We will return to an in-person option for Sunday school - children, youth, and adult - beginning in May. Details will follow soon.

Most importantly, moving on in a tired, scared, and angry world means living our daily lives like people who have bet the farm on Easter hope. Our opportunities to do that are limited only by our courage and imagination.

A Word of Pastoral Care

In the past month, I have been approached by several church members with the question, "Are you moving out of town?" The answer is "yes" with a "but." Donna and I are moving to my mother-in law's home just a few miles away. I continue to serve the Lord here at First Presbyterian and hospice. In inheriting a home, we find ourselves more rooted and finally laying a foundation in one area after almost 28 years of marriage. It is an unexpected and bittersweet blessing to own a home after all that has shaken our life foundations in the past 15 months. The parable in Matthew 7:24-27 has resonated with me during this transition.

This historic COVID-19 pandemic has been a foundation shaking storm of epic proportions - a collective trauma that has affected our health, national security, community, and even our own homes. Many foundations have cracked. We see emotional and spiritual weaknesses in society, and in ourselves. Yet the silver lining I offer in the midst of this extraordinary time is that there is no better time to repair the foundations. 




