

"O Come Emmanuel"

Christmas has already come, if you have a SiriusXM radio subscription. Multichannel Christmas music to satisfy every taste is streaming twenty-four hours a day. For many it's not a moment too soon. We crave the seasonal uplift as we live with the steady stream of sad news that seems to dominate most media.

With instant Christmas, something is gained, but something is lost. Christmas, the incarnation of God in the flesh of Jesus, snuck up on the world. As one author has written, "Advent begins in the dark." One of our oldest most familiar Advent hymns says:

"O come, O come, Emmanuel, and ransom captive Israel, that mourns in lonely exile here until the Son of God appear."

The darkness is real, but Christmas does finally come. Our deepest hunger receives the greatest answer:

"Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Israel."

For the four weeks of Advent we will use the hymn "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel" to focus on Jesus as God's deepest answer to our deepest longings. Each week we will watch an empty manger become brighter with the light of God's presence. The hymn

reminds us that Jesus is our Dayspring, Key of David, Wisdom From on High, and Desire of Nations. Behind each of these titles for Jesus is a rich Old Testament picture of the hoped for Emmanuel, God with us.

December 10th, we will have one special service at 11 am, a memorable "Walk To Bethlehem," as we prepare our hearts receive the good news of God's Christmas Love. Christmas Eve this year falls on Sunday. We'll have one service at 11 am as we finish the season of Advent. Then we'll turn our hearts to Christmas with two services on Christmas Eve at 5:30 and 10 pm. Both services will have candle lighting and communion. The first will be a family friendly celebration in the sanctuary. The later service will be quieter and more reflective and will be held in the chapel.

December will be a joyful time! Please make plans to join us throughout the Christmas season. The details for all our seasonal opportunities are found in this newsletter.

The SiriusXM Christmas will end about as fast as it arrived. But Christmas for us is not a fleeting thing. It's far more durable. The light of God's presence is always available. It is Jesus, God with us, who was, and is, and is to come.

Advent & Christmas

Join us this Advent as we join with Christians around the globe in this season of anticipation as we reflect on the hope, joy, peace, and love we find in Christ Jesus. This season remembers and celebrates the birth of Jesus, but also looks forward to the time when He will return to reunite Heaven and Earth forever. As a church, we invite you to enter a time of intentional meditation and prayer to prepare our hearts to celebrate His birth.

Our December Worship Services will include messages and music to prepare your hearts for the joyous celebration of Christmas. A familiar Advent hymn, "O Come, O Come Emmanuel" will provide a unifying theme for our worship. This hymn focuses on the titles of the coming Christ. These titles appeared in daily Vesper antiphons sung during the week before Christmas; their roots date to at least the reign of the Roman Emperor, Charlemagne (768-814).





Service Saturday - November 18th

Our Missions Committee and volunteers from the congregation spent the day providing all the ingredients for a Thanksgiving meal for some of the families with children at Walker Spivey Elementary and client families from Connections of Cumberland County.

A special shout out has to go to Mountaire Farms and their "Meals for Thousands" program. Mountaire provided 60 frozen chickens, canned goods, stuffing mix, and dessert mix. Thanks to the generosity of some special friends here at First Presbyterian, we were able to provide additional canned goods, gravy mix, and bags of potatoes. To keep the chickens frozen, a freezer was loaned to us for the event by a member of our congregation. All of the ingredients were packaged into boxes, each intended to feed a family of four.

Mountaire Farms gave away 38,000 meal boxes to churches and nonprofits for distribution to those struggling in poverty. As we sat in the long line of trucks at their pickup site, every 100 feet or so we were greeted by a Mountaire employee. Each employee thanked us for helping Mountaire share their blessings. One employee in particular asked us to share that they would be praying for our church, and for the families that we served. The Mountaire creed is printed on the side of each box that we shared Saturday - "To be good stewards of all the assets that God has entrusted to us".

On Saturday afternoon we had volunteers stationed at our Fellowship Hall and in front of Walker Spivey Elementary. Joining our crew at Walker Spivey were Principal Rachael Robinson, Vice Principal. Latonica McDonald, and the school social worker, Ms. Rebecca Carthens. Our Fellowship Hall volunteers met with 7 of the 10 families that were referred to us by Connections of Cumberland County, and each family was provided one or two of the boxes depending on the family size. Our Walker Spivey volunteers met with families referred by the school social worker, providing one or two boxes to each of those families. Deliveries were made to 6 families that did not have access to transportation. The few remaining boxes were given out by the Missions Committee out before Thanksgiving.


