

# A Pastoral Message from Dr. Mike Garrett

"On the third day he rose again from the dead..." These are the simple words with which the Apostles' Creed describes the most amazing of miracles. It's not an explanation. It's not even an attempt to convince people who don't believe it. It's what the church believes. It's how we explain ourselves to ourselves. Apart from it we would not exist.

This year, on Easter Sunday we will return to this simple confession from the Creed. We will read the scriptural stories of those who saw it for themselves and hear the promise so that we can know it for ourselves. Two-thousand years later, I believe the resurrection of Jesus is the only sufficient explanation for why we still gather, love one another, serve the least, the last, and the lost. We hope in the day when God in Christ will make all things right in a world in which so much is so wrong.

I hope you will ready yourselves for the good news of a risen Christ. There are several opportunities for worship and fellowship during Holy Week. Notice particularly in this newsletter "The Road To Calvary" and make plans to attend this special worship service on Wednesday, March 27.

During this season of Lent, we will also have our world mission conference, **"What In the World Is God Doing?"** Please study the brochure you will

receive, and attend all the events you can. The conference is designed to remind us that the resurrection we celebrate at Easter is news intended for the whole world, not just our piece of it. We are called to be witnesses across the city and across the globe.

N.T. Wright, one of our greatest New Testament scholars, wrote:

"The message of the resurrection is that this world matters! ...If Easter means Jesus Christ is only raised in a spiritual sense—[then] it is only about me... But if Jesus Christ is truly risen from the dead, Christianity becomes good news for the whole world—news which warms our hearts precisely because it isn't just about warming hearts."

May God warm our hearts this Easter, and more importantly, may God change our lives with the good news that on the third day Jesus rose from the dead. Because He did, we and this world will, too.

The sanctuary renovation fundraising effort is well underway.

#### We are delighted to announce that we are half way to our goal of \$1,300,000!

The last major renovation of the sanctuary was done in 1959. Twenty years ago, we painted and replaced the carpet. This renovation will consist of a completely redesigned choir loft and a platform on the lower level in front of the pulpit which will provide space for the orchestra, plays, choirs, etc. The pews will be refinished and the red carpets will be replaced throughout. In addition, the lighting in the sanctuary and the sound will be updated so that all can see and hear. The committee urges members to make a pledge during March if possible, so it will minimize the number of people that we need to contact in April.


