



We have been asked to supply Snack Kits for 30 children this year from Walker Spivey Elementary School. *That's three times as many as last year.* We can argue the point of why, but it comes down to helping a child be a little less hungry on the weekends.

Food donations are greatly appreciated and can be left in Eller Hall or upstairs near the Snack Kit room (#416).

Every other Friday we deliver to the schools and could use your help. Snack Kits are picked up at the church (already in bins) and delivered to the school counselor or the classroom.

We will be packing approximately 120 kits once a month. If our Sunday School classes and Small Groups volunteer one time, we will cover the school year. Packing can be done during Sunday School, when your small group meets, or a time that is convenient for you.


## The Stewardship of Our Healthy Mind and Body




